A Community of Learners

As a community of learners, you know that we have our three big goals this year:

- Religious Education: For all students to continue to improve their understanding of Scripture.
- **Numeracy:** For all students to improve their multiplicative thinking.
- **Literacy:** For all students to improve their use of vocabulary when writing.

This week, Mrs Gerrard, our Assistant Principal and Leader of Learning, Literacy explains how the teachers are developing students vocabulary when writing.

Our goal this year has been around being more deliberate in our word choice when writing. As a staff we have been working on how to assist students to move away from using more simple phrases and words through the introduction of word walls in the learning spaces. The older students are beginning to use thesaurus' (both digital and books) to challenge themselves to make more complex word choices that add depth to their writing.

In the younger grades, the children are being encouraged to move away from the favourites like "and" or "said" by replacing them with more descriptive language.

To further support students writing, our teachers are being very strategic in the choice of the books they read to the class and those that are used in reading groups. Making clear the links between the word choice authors make and how it entertains, informs or persuades an audience continues to ignite the passion that our students have for writing.

You only have to take a look at the Hall of Fame and learning spaces to see how many budding authors we have at St Bernadette's.

So, during the holidays here are a couple of things that you could do:

- Write a list together. This helps with your child organising ideas and recording them.
- Recount in writing a favourite holiday outing. Assist the child with details and specific language.
- · Read and discuss. Encourage your children to explore and express their thoughts and feedback about a text.
- Discuss technical language. Call items by their name. A wrench and hammer have their purpose just as a hard drive does.
- Begin a project together. I still recall putting together my family tree with my grandma.

Any chance you have to encourage your child to write is valuable.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



Sunday, 30 Sep 2018: Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B

An easy way to deal with this Gospel: 'anyone who is not against us is for us,' would be to emphasise the transformation of the relationship of Catholics with Protestants. Too easy.

But what about our relationship with the Muslims? There is a huge gulf between Muslims and us about Jesus Christ. Muslims do not even believe that he was killed on the cross, let alone raised to life. We hold to the testimony and the faith of the Apostles.

But Catholics also believe that the Divine Wind blows where it pleases amongst all people of all religious traditions (and of none). In the early Church this was expressed by saying that the Seeds of the Word were sown by the Holy Spirit in the hearts of all human beings.

We need to recognise the Seed of the Word in Islam – our shared belief in the one God, Creator of the cosmos, Lord of history, merciful and just. The task of the Church is to bring that Seed closer to the illumination of Divine Light so that it may eventually grow in belief that God is indeed One in the loving relationship of Triune life.

The world is holding its breath over the encounter of the Catholic Church and Islam. There is a history of mutual violence and contemporary barbarities which are inhumane and blasphemous. But, in the face of indifference and hostility to religion, at least in the West, it is good to acknowledge what we share in common.

We may take a moment to pray for the grace to relate to those Muslims whom we know in our own society in light of our faith that the Divine Wind has sown and is nurturing the Seed of the Word amongst them.


