## Tuesday, 25 Dec 2018: The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas)

The Gospel situates the birth of Jesus within Roman rule of the first century. Through the Incarnation, the ordinary becomes transparent and reveals the extraordinary; the divine is known in the child. Only those of humble heart experience this wonder. They behold it and they come to embrace it. In fact, it is the nature of this child, born in history, to reverse the orders of power.

God is portrayed as a valiant liberator who champions the cause of justice and who brings a liberation that reverses history and the ways of war, power and oppression. This reversal is made more shocking by the fact that the one who is the mighty warrior and conqueror of the nations is a child. This child is the weak and voiceless one, the one who has neither power nor legal rights. God's reversal of the long-standing realities of this world is accomplished through the apparently insignificant, through the gift of this child who is given to us in the middle of the night.

Something new has happened: the age of God's fulfilment has arrived. The age of grace and fresh hope, made available to all people of good will, is an era of redemptive presence. Now all people can walk in the newness of life and grace. Yet, while this new age has begun, it is not yet fully realised. We live believing in its presence and awaiting its fulfilment. Although we are celebrating Christmas, we still await the final coming of the Lord.



## LEARNING MATTERS



#### Positive Behaviour Support for Learning update

St Bernadette's strives to create a positive learning environment for all our students using Positive Behavior Support 4 Learning (PBS4L). Some examples of PBS4L principles are

- Encouraging all staff to aim for 4 positive student interactions for every correction.
- Collaboration and implementation of PBS4L by all school staff in order to create learning environments conducive to academic learning and achievement.
- A belief that just like academic learning, students need to be explicitly taught behavioral expectations, need to
  practice the skills to achieve those expectations, and may require additional opportunities or re-teaching of skills. We
  do not make the assumption that students automatically understand what we mean when we ask them to "be good."
- Active supervision and positive interactions by staff during transitions and unstructured activities.

As we begin the new school year we will be teaching the school-wide expectations in all areas of the school: classroom, playground, hall, toilets, etc. Teachers will also teach the expectations for their individual classrooms - explicitly demonstrating what the behaviors look like, giving students opportunities to practice, and giving the rationale behind the expectation.

Staff have finalised lesson plans and procedures ready to launch into 2019. Plans are also in place for new signage around the school reminding everyone of our expectations in addition to our mascot, Bernie Bright, to greet the community. There are exciting plans in place for the official launch of PBS4L early 2019. The students have also noticed some brightly coloured letter boxes in the breezeway, but what are they for? All will be revealed in 2019.

### MAI - The Mathematical Assessment Interview

All families have now received a note about the Mathematical Assessment Interview (MAI). This is a one on one teacher/student interview where your child will be asked questions in relation to their knowledge of counting, place value, addition & subtraction as well as multiplication & division.

As a school, we keep data from year to year to track student progress in Mathematics. Individually, we use this information to identify areas of strength and challenge for your child as a Mathematician. Opportunities will be provided before the start of the school year 2019, for all students, Kindergarten to Year 6, to come to school for approximately 30 minutes per child to participate in the MAI with a teacher.

An electronic booking system is now open and parents can nominate time slots for their child. These interview times begin for Years 1 to 6 on Wednesday 30th January and and continue on Thursday 31st January for Kindergarten students.

All students from Years 1 to Year 6 return to school on Thursday 31st January. Kindergarten students first full day at school is Friday 1st February.
