## **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

#### Sunday, 25 Nov 2018: Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe - Year B

What are we to make of the famous reply of Jesus to Pilate: 'My kingdom is not of this world'? Left there, it sounds as though Jesus is talking about a realm which is far removed from terrestrial concerns. Perhaps our task as his followers is to meditate into a blissful nothingness, to live other-worldly lives.

It is a poor translation, and it should read: 'My kingdom is not *from* this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would have fought to stop my being handed over.' Of all the ways in which our Lord could have contrasted his realm with all the other ways in which societies are ruled, he chose a contrast about the use of force. Rather, his reign springs from his Father's will that humanity should live together in a realm of non-violence.

We can easily criticise ISIL's blasphemous use of barbaric violence in the supposed service of religion. It is the most extreme opposite of Our Lord's teaching which He embodied in his practice. But, even for us, the challenge is there to restrain too-ready resort to armed violence and to humanely moderate its exercise where it is used to protect the innocent.

We could pause for a moment to pray for the coming of the Kingdom, not as an 'out of this world' experience, but in the words of the Our Father: 'Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done *on earth* as it is in heaven.'

## **LEARNING MATTERS**

# One Box - So much Mathematics

An important learning for children is that Mathematics is everywhere in the world around them. Perhaps even more important is the concept of how interconnected the different strands of Mathematics are.



Take this box for example. Mathematically we could explore:

- 3D Space what kind of object? What are its dimensions? How many faces, edges, and vertices? Could I use a net to create a copy? What would a cross section look like?
- **2D space** what kind of shapes do we see? How many sides do they have? Are any sides equal or parallel? What might their area be? Is there any symmetry? Could I make the faces tessellate? What would happen if I rotate, translate or reflect a face? Are there any diagonals?
- **Angles** What kind of angles can we see? What might the angle sum of the shapes be? Is this true for all 4 sided shapes?
- Mass how much might it weigh? What if it was filled with something? What unit would I measure this weight with? Would the weight be different depending what I filled it with?
- Volume and Capacity How much space might it take up? How much could it hold? What kind of things could it hold? What kinds of things would fill it completely?
- Multiplication & Division what if I had 3 rows of boxes with 4 in each row, how many is that all together? What if I shared the boxes between 6 friends - How many each?
- Addition & Subtraction What if I had 6 of these and found 4 more How many do I have now? What if I took 5 away How many do I have now?

This is just a small sample of the possible ways one simple object can be a starting point to explore so many mathematical possibilities!

## CHILDREN'S CORNER


### Year 4
