Sunday 11 Feb 2024

**Sixth Sunday in Ordinary
Time Year B**

Mark 1:40-45

The leprosy left him and he was cured.

A leper came to Jesus and pleaded on his knees: 'If you want to' he said 'you can cure me.' Feeling sorry for him, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him. 'Of course I want to!' he said. 'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.



REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

We know that we will all have to face some kind of suffering, and so we try to prepare ourselves for it. Yet when it comes, as prepared as we try to be, it can overtake us with such fury that we fall back defenceless. We look to others for support and assistance, and if we are fortunate, we find it. However, even in the most supportive of communities, suffering tends to alienate us from those who are healthy and secure. Suffering reminds us of our own finitude and the contingent nature of all of life. It threatens our sense of order.

Jesus is not deterred by human suffering. He welcomes all who approach him; his healing touch reincorporates those who have been ostracised; his loving embrace reassociates those who have been alienated. In the reign of God, there are no outsiders. All belong to Jesus, and, therefore, all belong to each other. When the one afflicted is embraced by the community, the community is an authentic manifestation of the inclusive reign of God.

In suffering we witness human vulnerability and our desperate need of each other and of God. There, at the edge of life and on the fringes of the community, we may experience the tenderness and compassion of God. The loving touch of Christ that can heal our souls, if not our bodies. It is there that we may most authentically participate in the cross of Christ. Joined to him we are anything but unproductive or worthless.

CHILDREN'S DISCUSSION STARTERS

A beginning point for discussion of this week's Gospel with children:

In today's gospel who came to Jesus?

The man had a sickness which made him an outcast. What does it mean to be an outcast?

What did Jesus do when he met him?

Jesus showed compassion and kindness when others would have sent the man away.

What did the man do when he was cured?

What would it be like to be an outcast or an outsider?

Jesus asks us to be kind to outsiders. How can we show kindness to people who do not feel included?

We pray that this week we will look out for ways we can show kindness to people in need.

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Ash Wednesday

Wednesday 14 February, Ash Wednesday, marks the beginning of Lent. Lent is a time of preparation for Easter marked by repentance, fasting, reflection, and ultimately celebration. The Lenten season culminates with Holy Week, which includes Palm Sunday and the joyous celebration of Easter.

Matthew 6:1-6. 16-18

Jesus said to his disciples:

‘Be careful not to parade your good deeds before men to attract their notice; by doing this you will lose all reward from your Father in heaven. So when you give alms, do not have it trumpeted before you; this is what the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets to win men’s admiration. I tell you solemnly, they have had their reward. But when you give alms, your left hand must not know what your right is doing; your almsgiving must be secret, and your Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you.

‘And when you pray, do not imitate the hypocrites: they love to say their prayers standing up in the synagogues and at the street corners for people to see them. I tell you solemnly, they have had their reward. But when you pray, go to your private room and, when you have shut your door, pray to your Father who is in that secret place, and your Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you.

‘When you fast do not put on a gloomy look as the hypocrites do: they pull long faces to let men know they are fasting. I tell you solemnly, they have had their reward. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your

face, so that no one will know you are fasting except your Father who sees all that is done in secret; and your Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you.'

Historical Context – The mark of the cross

The tradition of marking the forehead with ash on Ash Wednesday can be traced back to the ancient Jewish action of dusting oneself with ash as a sign of repentance and mourning for wrongful actions. It was a public declaration of the acknowledgement of the wrong and the commitment to turn one's life around and try not to make the same mistake again. It still remains a public declaration that during the period of Lent those who wear the cross of ash are going to attempt to turn around their lives and re-focus themselves more fully on God.

Gospel Focus: 'Your Father'

Jesus repeatedly uses the phrase 'your Father' in this passage. In his own language, the word Jesus was using was the equivalent of 'daddy' or 'papa'. It reflects a very intimate and very child-like relationship with God. This was a challenging new way of imaging God for the people of the 1st Century. Jesus' emphasis on the intimate, loving relationship between God and ourselves is highlighted by his use of 'your Father'. He doesn't say 'my Father'. That same intimate relationship is open to each and every one of us! We are God's children.

Have you thought? – 'They have had their reward'

The gospel writer has Jesus repeatedly stating this seemingly dismissive fact. The word 'reward' had a very specific meaning in business – it meant 'paid in full' – and was often applied to the purchase of a slave. In the passage, Jesus is effectively saying, their account has been settled; their fate has been determined. Because they choose to twist religious practices to their own benefit they have sealed their fate – that is their reward! Their 'reward' can only be changed by a dramatic change of heart; turning back to God and doing their works for God's sake, not their own.

Afternoon Dismissals

At 3:05pm all children will go to their designated areas:

- **Bus line** - These children will be accompanied by a teacher to the bus stop. The teacher on duty crosses the children using the Crossing.
- **Walkers** - These children assemble with Drive Through students and leave school grounds through the front gate and walk directly home.
- **Cox Crescent Drive Through line** - Parents choosing the Cox Crescent Drive Thru are asked to drive to the school driveway gate with their family name displayed. (This sign will be supplied to all parents.)
 - ❖ Please keep the sign displayed until the children are in the car
 - ❖ A member of staff will call your child and direct them to their family car.
 - ❖ If a child is not 'ready' the parent will be asked to continue around the crescent and 'try again'.
 - ❖ Please remain in the queue even if your child is in the car and the car in front is not ready to go. Overtaking is extremely dangerous in the narrow street.
 - ❖ Parents are asked NOT to queue on Evans Road as this interrupts the flow of traffic. Please drive around the block and rejoin the queue.
 - ❖ **No U Turns** are allowed
 - ❖ Please obey School zone times - ie no stopping or parking
 - ❖ Do not stop on the pedestrian crossing
 - ❖ Only use the drive through if your child can confidently get into the car and put on their own seatbelt. Parents are NOT to alight the car to help their child.
- **Parent Pick Up** - Parents choosing to park their cars, will do so in the Church Car Park or other legal parking areas. In the interest of safety, when parking in the Church Car Park, parents are asked to reverse into the space. Parents then walk to the COLA to collect their children. Once children have been dismissed from class and see their parents, they may leave the premises. No child is to walk to their family car alone.
- **After School Care line / COSHC** - These children wait outside the Kindy rooms to be collected by the COSHC Staff.
- If a child is being collected by someone other than a parent, the teacher should be notified, preferably in writing.

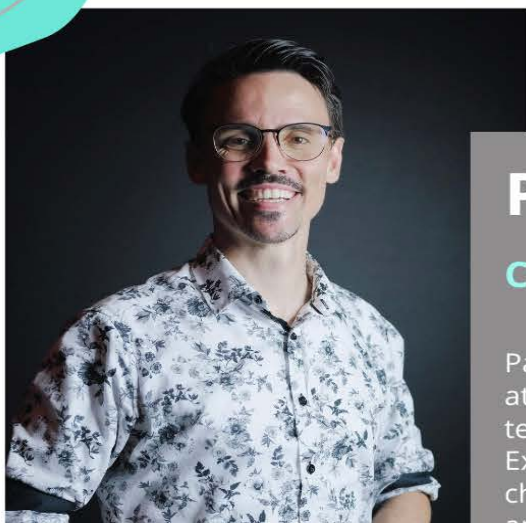

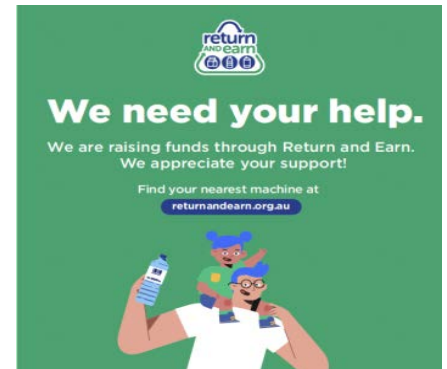
Return and Earn

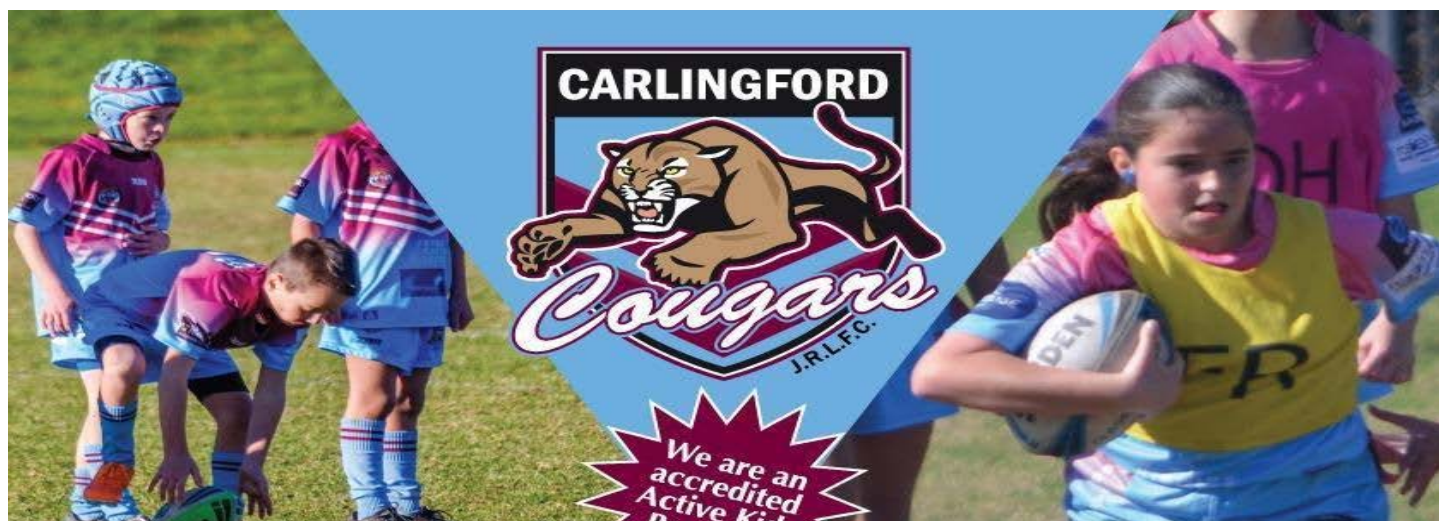

NSW Australian Football Primary All Schools Girls 12 Years & Under Selection Trial 2024



The NSW Australian Football Primary All Schools Girls 12 Years and Under Pathway Program is a School Sport Unit initiative. Initial trials will be held during Term 1 to select 6 All Schools teams from identified areas around NSW. These selected teams will participate in a final championship to be held in Albury on 20 and 21 May 2024. A NSW All Schools team will be selected from the final championship to compete at the School Sport Australia, Australian Football Girls 12 Years and Under Championship in Victoria from 4 to 10 August 2024.

Who can register to trial?

This trial is only for primary school girls 12 years and under. Girls can be 12, however must not be turning 13 in 2024. Girls enrolled in secondary school are ineligible to trial. Tackling is permitted and will occur at this level of competition. Girls turning 9 years of age or younger during 2024 are deemed too young for selection and will not be eligible to trial.

Cost?

Cost per student is \$10.00, payable through the registration process.

Students must only register for and attend one of the trials.
