Everyone has settled back into school and 2024 is promising to be a fun filled and successful year for our community.

We have had our first grade mass, first assembly and our parent teacher information night. It is a relief that we begin the school year with a sense of "normal" and routines are back in place.

Part of a successful year at school in the classroom is the setting up of routines. Every classroom may look slightly different in their routines, however they all have the same purpose. This being to create a safe and positive learning environment, where students are encouraged to develop independence in their learning.

Just as routines are important at school they are also important in the home to prepare for school. Here are some suggested tasks and routines that we encourage for home that will set our students up for success.

Have a firm bedtime that is early enough so they have some wind down time before needing to go to sleep. Limit screen time, especially just before going to bed.

Keep phones, ipads out of the bedrooms when children are sleeping.

Make sure they have a good breakfast each morning.

Make sure they are able to tie their own shoelaces.

Ensure they know what is in their lunchbox and what to eat at recess and what should be kept for lunch.

Getting dressed independently each morning (especially getting jackets on and off)

All children should be responsible for making sure their hat is in their bag.

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

GEN 22: 1-2, 9-13, 15-18 ROM 8: 31-34

MK 9: 2-10

There are so many elements to the story of the transfiguration. Jesus seems to be selecting an 'inner circle' – Peter, James and John. Were they his most trusted disciples? Were they the smartest? Or were they the ones that most needed the lesson to be spelt out clearly?

Their time on the mountaintop was like nothing they had ever experienced before. *Dazzlingly white* is Mark's description, a white unseen on earth. Jesus wasn't simply showered in rays of sunshine. The change came from within and He radiated calm as well as light.

They wanted it to last forever. I dare say we would feel the same! Let's build a tent for each of you, Peter says. Let's stay here – just us. Let's not go through that whole death and resurrection scenario. Let's avoid that pain. Such a human response, don't you think? Life is good, let's keep it that way. Don't make me return to real life-to work, to the challenges that the world is throwing at us and the people we support.

But no, Jesus leads them back. They have a job to do. The job ahead of Jesus is worse than most! The disciples don't realise it yet, but they are on a roller coaster. They've had this moment of exhilaration. They return to real life-one that is already not easy, and soon, after just learning that they should listen to Him above all else, they will lose their rabbi and friend. His crucifixion is not that far away. In Mark's gospel, it's a handful of chapters.

How often do we have those moments of immense happiness or contentment that we wish could last forever? More importantly, what do we learn from those times? Peter, James and John received an enormously important message on that mountaintop, about who Jesus really was. In last week's reflection I pondered the growth or transformation that might come from our life lows, our crises.

Equally, there are lessons in our highs if we are attuned to them.

NAPLAN

In 2024, NAPLAN will be held from **Wednesday 13 March to Monday 25 March.** Our Timetable of the schedule will be sent closer to the date.

Students in **Years 3 & 5** who are enrolled at a school are expected to participate in four NAPLAN tests:

- writing
- reading
- conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation)
- numeracy.

All schools in NSW undertake NAPLAN online. However, Year 3 students do the writing test on paper. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the format of the tests before the NAPLAN test window.

Supporting your child

NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills your child is already learning at school.

It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress.

The best approach for preparing your child for NAPLAN is to encourage your child to do the best they can on the day.

Excessive preparation or the use of coaching providers is not recommended.

Public demonstration site

The <u>public demonstration site</u> is available for students, teachers and parents to familiarise themselves with the types of questions, tools and functions available for the NAPLAN tests. It includes demonstration tests for each NAPLAN year level, test domain and alternative tests for students with disability.

These exciting activities include hikes, camps, swimming, bike rides, cooking, campfires, skits, singing, games, canoeing, leadership practice & hands on problem solving.


Many students from school are already Scouts, so you are sure to have friends within our group.

NSW Australian Football Primary All Schools Girls 12 Years & Under Selection Trial 2024



The NSW Australian Football Primary All Schools Girls 12 Years and Under Pathway Program is a School Sport Unit initiative. Initial trials will be held during Term 1 to select 6 All Schools teams from identified areas around NSW. These selected teams will participate in a final championship to be held in Albury on 20 and 21 May 2024. A NSW All Schools team will be selected from the final championship to compete at the School Sport Australia, Australian Football Girls 12 Years and Under Championship in Victoria from 4 to 10 August 2024.

Who can register to trial?

This trial is only for primary school girls 12 years and under. Girls can be 12, however must not be turning 13 in 2024. Girls enrolled in secondary school are ineligible to trial. Tackling is permitted and will occur at this level of competition. Girls turning 9 years of age or younger during 2024 are deemed too young for selection and will not be eligible to trial.

Cost?

Cost per student is \$10.00, payable through the registration process.
