SUNDAY SCRIPTURE PREVIEW

Sunday, May 13 2018: The Ascension of the Lord - Year B Mk 16:15-20 The Lord Jesus was taken into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God.



This Sunday we celebrate the feast of the Ascension. Sadly this feast sometimes loses out as an 'in-between' event, bookended by the 'greater' feasts of Easter and next week Pentecost. However, the significance of this feast is important to reflect on as it provides the foundation of our new relationship as a people with our eternal God.

The Ascension of Jesus into the arms of his Father is not the end of a life's story, but simply the beginning of new life. Pope Francis points this out in that the Ascension "does not point to Jesus' absence, but tells us that he is alive in our midst in a new way." Jesus' legacy to us is a new relationship, and for Pope Francis this legacy is the heart of the Joy of the Gospel. © *SVDP goodworks*

KINDERGARTEN 2019

Enrolment interviews are well underway for Kindergarten 2019. If you have a child or know of a child that will be starting Kindergarten next year, please collect and return an enrolment package as soon as possible so that they do not miss out. Enrolment packages are available on the school website and at the school office.

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NAPLAN

We wish our children in Years 3 and 5 the very best during their NAPLAN assessments next week. The NAPLAN assessments measure our student's performance on a range of basic skills at a given time.

NAPLAN dates are as follows:

Tuesday 15th May: Language Conventions and Writing

Wednesday 16th May: Reading

Thursday 17th May: Numeracy

Friday 18th May: A 'catch up' day is scheduled for students who missed a test or were absent on a test day.

So, my advice to the children in Years 3 and 5 is to have a good night's sleep the night before, eat a healthy breakfast before coming to school, listen to all the instructions given to you by your teacher and just try your very best.

PLAY EQUIPMENT

Parents are to supervise their children closely while playing on the Play Equipment. All children are not to play on the equipment before school.

DRIVE THROUGH

* During the afternoon drive-thru, your car must have your family's name clearly displayed inside the front windscreen. It is impossible for teachers to know every family in the school and it is very difficult to see faces through windscreens. Please make sure the sign in your car is visible in Cox Crescent only. Do not drive down Evans Road with this sign showing.

* Please do not do any U-Turns from the drive-thru line in Cox Crescent.

* Please be mindful of local residents and do not park in driveways including the parish driveway. At all times adhere to the traffic signs around the school. The rangers will target illegal parking behaviour and parking breaches especially in a school zone with a fine.

* Please be patient and wait for the car ahead to move before you do so.

* Please do not overtake and pull in front of other cars waiting in the cue.

* Please do not leave your car when using Drive Through.

* No parking in NO STOPPING zones as it may block the crossing, which is a finable offence.

* Children are not allowed in the school car park on their own after school. Please make sure your children are with you.

* When parking in the church car park please reverse park into the space, so that your car is facing inwards. In both instances, you should have a clear line of sight. As we all know children are very unpredictable, so lets try and be proactive in being safe conscious at school.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

ALL CHILDREN SHOULD BE WEARING THEIR WINTER SCHOOL UNIFORM BY MONDAY 14 MAY

The wearing of full, correct school uniform is compulsory and all items of clothing must be clearly marked with the child's name.

To demonstrate school pride uniforms should be kept neat and tidy -

- * shirts tucked in and buttoned
- * ties correctly worn
- * shoelaces tied and shoes polished
- * for safety reasons only plain stud / sleeper earrings may be worn to school
- * hair of collar length and longer, should be tied back with maroon/blue ribbon, scrunchie or headband
- * haircuts should not be extremes of fashion

* predominantly white sport shoes are to be worn only on sport days, with black shoes to be worn on all other days

* children may only wear school tracksuit pants on sports day

* school hats offer some protection from the sun, while the wearing of hats in Term 2 is not compulsory, it is advised.

GIRLS WINTER UNIFORM

Winter maroon and grey dress (knee length). Long sleeve sky blue blouse with maroon tab tie. Maroon jumper / cardigan with school crest. Long grey socks or stockings. Regulation black school shoes. Maroon school hat / legionnaires cap with school crest.

BOYS WINTER UNIFORM

Grey regulation trousers. Long sleeved sky blue shirt. Maroon and blue pinstrip pre-loop school tie. Grey socks with maroon and sky blue striped band. Regulation black school shoes. Maroon school hat / legionnaires cap with school crest.
