Dear families of St Bernadette's.

Parents have been appointed by God himself as the first and principal educators of their children (Pope John Paul II). A couple of years ago, a university study asked a randomly selected number of parents to respond to the question, "What does it mean to be a parent?" Here are extracts from three responses: "Responsibility for teaching about love and caring for others, responsibility for keeping them safe and secure, so their personalities can develop in a healthy way." "Something very special, close and loving: it means an enormous responsibility, it changes your life-course: once you start being a parent, it's an ongoing thing with worries and anxieties attached." "It's the most important job you'll ever have to do in your life. The social ramifications of parenting are important. because the responsibility is yours well-adjusted to bring happy, people into adulthood ... and the joy and despair are often only seconds apart.

Your role as parents is truly a privilege, to have given life to a child and have accepted the responsibility, great though it is, of nurturing and providing for that child through those developmental years. As parents, you are the source of our child's affirmation. Children will believe what the people they love and trust believe, including how they feel about school and their own ability to learn. So, after praise and encouragement, encourage perseverance. A warm, supportive home atmosphere influences your child's confidence and motivation to become a successful learner.

Positive Behaviour Support for Learning (PBS4L) is a whole school program, which our school has embarked on, that actively promotes positive behaviour. It enables students to develop a clear understanding of required expectations, become responsible for their own behaviour and work together to create a positive, supportive, productive and harmonious learning community. As always these expectations for our school family, revolve around our rules of "I am respectful", "I am safe" and "I am a learner".

With Mother's Day and Family Week celebrated recently, it is a special time to reflect, celebrate and give thanks for parents and families, especially all the families that make up our school family.

Gracious God, Bless our families and provide for their needs. Protect them from harm and bring Your peace to their hearts.

Help us to be the family You intend us to be.

May we be a blessing to one another and to others.

We pray this in Jesus' name. Amen.

SUNDAY SCRIPTURE PREVIEW

Sunday, May 27 2018: The Most Holy Trinity - Year B

Matthew 28: 16-20

Baptise them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit

The Easter season celebrates some of the most important events and beliefs in Christian tradition. In the last seven weeks, we have remembered Jesus' Last Supper with his friends (regarded as the institution or establishment of the Eucharist); Jesus' death on the cross; the discovery of the empty tomb on Easter Sunday; the appearances of the Risen Lord to his disciples; the Ascension into heaven; and finally, the Holy Spirit filling the disciples at Pentecost. They are events that have shaped Christian belief for nearly 2,000 years. They provide the basis of beliefs and teachings such as: Christ present in the Eucharist; the resurrection of Jesus and the hope of resurrection for all people; the divinity of Jesus; and the ongoing action of the Holy Spirit in the world. The period of Easter-Pentecost celebrates these truly momentous events, beliefs and teachings.

Almost to round off this extraordinary focus on Christian beliefs and teachings, the Church this week celebrates the central doctrine of Christian faith: the Trinity. The belief in the Trinity is the belief that there are three 'persons' in the one Godhead: Father; Son; and Holy Spirit. The understanding and articulation of this doctrine occurred over time and was not until well after the writing of the gospels and other New Testament letters. Consequently, there are no specific scriptural passages that identify explicitly the doctrine of the Trinity. This week's gospel passage, the commissioning of the disciples from the Gospel of Matthew is perhaps the closest any New Testament writer comes to an expression of the Trinity when Jesus instructs the disciples to baptise 'in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'. © Greg Sunter

We raised \$246.50, thank you for your generosity.






















FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Casual Work

School Crossing Supervisors – Work with your community 1 x Casual position – Parramatta Local Government Area (000066R9)

An important person in a child's school life is the School Crossing Supervisor, who ensures they cross the road safely. The role requires minimal hours out of your day and gives something worthwhile back to the community.

The hours are usually 8.00am to 9.30am and/or 2.30pm to 4.00pm Monday to Friday during school terms. The base rate is \$22.46 - \$26.95 per hour.

All the qualifications you need are community spirit, good communication skills, an alert and professional attitude to work and a reliable personality. The casual hours and school holidays would suit a parent or grandparent, a retiree or anyone wanting meaningful work — but not full-time.

Training for your key responsibilities of directing traffic to stop at the designated crossing and giving clear instructions to infants and primary school students to cross the road safely, will be provided. You may be required to attend a health assessment. Appointment is subject to a Working with Children Check clearance.
