FROM THE PRINCIPAL.....

Dear families of St Bernadette's,

Today you will receive your child's Mid Year Report. Here are some important reminders for mums and dads of children in Years 1-6, as you interpret the report - remember 'C' is the grade standard and don't forget to look at your child's 'Effort' for each Key Learning Area. As I've mentioned before, the conversation a parent would have with their child who has received a C and has 'Outstanding' Effort would be a very different conversation to the one where a child receives a C for example, and receives an 'Improvement Needed' for Effort. This is a great time to connect with your child and have a valuable discussion about their growth and how they can continue to improve their learning.

This communication between school and home continues next week with Parent Teacher interviews. These interviews are an ideal opportunity to celebrate your child's achievements and identify any direction for the remainder of the year. I thank our dedicated staff for their hard work during this assessment and reporting period.

Last week, Years 5 and 6 went on an overnight excursion to Canberra. This excursion was subsidised by the Australian Government through the Pacer contribution and by the P & F. While it was very chilly in the nation's capital, it was a real delight to see the students excited and so well behaved, as they represented our school. SUNDAY SCRIPTURE PREVIEW

Sunday, June 24 2018: *The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist - Mass during the day*Year B

Lk 1:57-66. 80

John is his name.

When Elizabeth gave birth to a son, the whole village was quite certain that the child would be called Zechariah after his father. But Elizabeth resisted and Zechariah had no hesitation in writing, 'His name is John'. This caused great consternation in the village. This could only mean that more shocking breaks with tradition were to come. And in the last verse of today's Gospel, we learn that this now young man is not preparing for priestly service at the Temple!

He is out in the wilderness! He has adopted the lifestyle of the most marginal, living outside settled existence where tradition suffocates.

Pope Francis constantly urges us to be challenged by those existing on the margins. This encompasses not only those who are suffering exclusion, injustice or who are simply without the necessities of life. © *Fr Michael Tate*.

LEARNING MATTERS

As mentioned in a previous newsletter, throughout the year we will be sharing with you what we are doing in class in regards to unpacking Scripture passages. We as a school, are using the Parramatta CEO model, the 'Senses of Scripture', which is broken down into 3 areas, Literal, Spiritual and Application. Today I provide a breakdown of this Sunday's Gospel Luke 1:57-66. 80 John is his name, The birth of John the Baptist using the 'Senses of Scripture'.

Lk 1:57-66. 80

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

John is his name

The time came for Elizabeth to have her child, and she gave birth to a son; and when her neighbours and relations heard that the Lord had shown her so great a kindness, they shared her joy.

Now on the eighth day they came to circumcise the child; they were going to call him Zechariah after his father, but his mother spoke up. 'No,' she said 'he is to be called John.' They said to her, 'But no one in your family has that name', and made signs to his father to find out what he wanted him called. The father asked for a writing tablet and wrote, 'His name is John.' And they were all astonished. At that instant his power of speech returned and he spoke and praised God. All their neighbours were filled with awe and the whole affair was talked about throughout the hill country of Judaea. All those who heard of it treasured it in their hearts. 'What will this child turn out to be?' they wondered. And indeed the hand of the Lord was with him. The child grew up and his spirit matured. And he lived out in the wilderness until the day he appeared openly to Israel.

I enjoyed going to Questacon because my friends and I got to conquer our fear of heights by going on the Free Fall.





































EXTRA CURRICULUM

AROUND THE DIOCESE

Dear Parishioners of St Bernadette Church,

We are delighted to invite you to see and purchase handmade religious articles made by the Sisters of St. Elisabeth Convent (Belarus).

The exposition will take place on Friday, July 06, 2018.

The Sisterhood of Saint Elisabeth was founded in 1996. For more than 15 years our sisters have been rendering spiritual, social and financial support to the sick and the suffering at the National Psychiatric Clinic, the boarding home for children with special needs and mentally challenged adults, a TB clinic.

In recent years a rehabilitation centre for the homeless, drug and alcohol addicts, ex-prisoners was established 20 miles away from the Convent. About 200 residents live here today. Many lost and struggling people get a chance to tackle their problems and start a new life with God.

A rehabilitation facility for females was established in 2012. Women released from jail, the homeless and mentally challenged women stay there. Today there are 11 women and one toddler at this farmstead.

To help these people workshops were established on the grounds of the Convent. Many of these sick people have a possibility to express themselves in art for God working together with the nuns and sisters and making beautiful articles (hand painted icons, crosses, crucifixes, woodcarvings, embroidered and ceramic gifts, vestments).

All these goods are made with love and prayer and bring blessing to home. You will support many people in need by purchasing items of devotions for yourselves and your beloved ones.
