## SUNDAY SCRIPTURE PREVIEW

Sunday, 5 Aug 2018: **Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time** - Year B

**John 6:24-35**



***Whoever comes to me will never be hungry; whoever believes in me will never thirst.***

Jesus insists that he is the true bread from heaven; he is the real basis of our survival. The people followed him because they saw him as a source of bread; they did not realise that he is really the source of life. If we fill ourselves with all that the world provides as nourishment we will still hunger. Only faith in Jesus can satisfy our deepest hungers, and we will not be able to survive apart from him.

Acceptance of Jesus as the source of our life and the very nourishment of our spirits effects a total transformation in us. We will no longer be content to live with full bellies but empty minds. We will put aside our old selves steeped in ignorance and self-interest and put on a new self, created in his image. Having fed on the bread from heaven, we will be mysteriously transformed into it. The spirit of our minds will be renewed by his teaching. As a result, we will be able to launch out into a way of living that witnesses to our new understanding, our new life.

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## The Transfiguration of the Lord

The Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord is remembered on Monday August 6. In Mark 9:2-10 Jesus takes his most trusted disciples up a high mountain to allow them to share in what he knows is about to occur. It is a very clear teaching moment in which Jesus hopes the disciples are going to finally grasp the truth about him. As the disciples stand by, Jesus is transformed before them – suddenly bathed in light and his clothes become dazzlingly white. The disciples also see Moses and Elijah standing and talking with Jesus. Moses was the great Law-giver of Jewish tradition and Elijah the great prophet.

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## Feast Day of Saint Mary of the Cross

The Feast Day of Saint Mary of the Cross, Australia's first saint, will be celebrated on Wednesday August 8. She had a strong love for God and was committed to helping those in need. Saint Mary of the Cross, together with Fr Julian Tenison Woods established the first free Australian Catholic school. She co-founded Australia's first religious order, the Sisters of St Joseph. Saint Mary of the Cross was canonised by Pope Benedict XVI on 17 October 2010.

# LEARNING MATTERS

## **Staff Professional Development in Religion Education, Mathematics and Project Based Learning**

As a community of learners, the staff of St Bernadette's are always striving to improve learning outcomes for all children. One of the most valuable means to do this is through Professional Development. This year we are undertaking a range of Professional Development, both on and off site to develop our capacity as teachers in many curriculum areas.

### **Religious Education**

Recently, several of our teachers attended a lecture by Dr Edward Sri, a theologian who is working with the Diocese to deepen teacher understanding of the Gospels.

### **Mathematics**

Our infants Teachers are involved in K-2 Numeracy, supported by CEDP Teacher Educator Geraldine Caleta. This course provides teaching ideas and methods to implement in the classroom and will run throughout Term 3.

Our Stage 3 teachers will soon be attending the Stage 3 Multiplicative Thinking course, based on the research of Professor Peter Sullivan. In between sessions the Stage 3 children will be exposed to challenging tasks which aim to strengthen their conceptual understanding of multiplication and division.

Across the school, teachers continue to implement strategies learnt at last year's intensive Whole school Multiplicative Thinking Course.

### **Project Based Learning**

Our Stage 3 teachers were visited this week by the ARIE Team (Advanced Reasoning in Education) from Texas, who specialise in Project Based Learning. This was a valuable opportunity for feedback and ideas to move forward in this area.

Our Stage 2 teachers will be attending a 3 day intensive workshop on Project Based Learning in Week 3, also run by the ARIE team. This will help to embed these practices throughout the school.

We look forward to having the staff who have attended these Professional Development courses having the opportunity to share their learning with the whole staff at upcoming in school meetings.

**Jacob L** - I felt nervous because I was having the only son of God and I felt happy because I was having Him for the first time.


**Marie-Elise B** - On my First Communion Day I felt very special.
