A Community of Learners

As a community of learners we have our three big goals this year:

- Religious Education: For all students to continue to improve their understanding of Scripture.
- Numeracy: For all students to improve their multiplicative thinking.
- <u>Literacy:</u> For all students to improve their use of vocabulary when writing.

This week, Mr Kensell, our Leader of Learning, Numeracy explains how the teachers are developing students multiplicative thinking skills and the ways in which you can help your child at home.

Developing Multiplicative Thinking Skills

At St Bernadette's, a major focus in Mathematics over the past years has been to develop sound multiplicative thinking skills in all children. At school, this is done by exposing the children to rich problem solving opportunities, where a diverse range of approaches can be used to work through problems. Children are becoming used to being challenged and having to persist when working on a task. Through this focus on hard thinking and trying to find multiple methods to solve problems, children are learning that the hard work along the way is often just as important as the answer itself. The children are also learning that mistakes are part of the path to greater success. By encouraging our children to solve problems in two or more different ways, we are building their capacity to be flexible and confident mathematicians

Outside of school, there are so many opportunities to get your children to think mathematically! Whether it be setting the table, organising a collection of objects or helping you shop, mathematics is everywhere. Word games such as scrabble are opportunities for children to practise a range of calculations. By engaging with your children in these ways you are helping to foster curiosity and interest in Mathematics.





RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Sunday, 28 Oct 2018: Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B

Bartimaeus sat on the side of the way, having pilgrims throw coins onto his cloak spread out before him. But the presence of Jesus encouraged him to abandon his cloak, jump up from his ground level existence and ask to truly see the way from Jesus' perspective.

Jesus responded to this act of faith by curing the disease so that Bartimaeus could see ahead in the same way as Jesus and follow him on 'the Way' (the earliest name for Christianity).

You and I can remain with the security of a familiar existence, hoping to be tossed a few coins of consolation to satisfy our various hungers. But Jesus wants us to take courage, to jump up and to share his vision.

This takes faith, but we are in a better situation than Bartimaeus. *He* knew only that Jesus was on the way from Jericho to Jerusalem. *We* believe that, in Jerusalem, Jesus was lifted well above ground level and then had the astounding victory over the worst that death could do.

We might pause for a moment to pray for the courage to abandon whatever is keeping us grounded, so that with Bishop Richard of Chichester we may see Christ more clearly, love him more dearly, and follow him more nearly.
