Some Dos, Don'ts and Think Before that need to be remembered:



Don't: Approach any child that is not your own to discuss possible issues. Just as you would feel that it is not appropriate for another parent to reprimand your child, it is not okay for you to approach and try to discipline someone else's child.

Think Before: You ring another parent about their child's behaviour. Kids have an amazing way of being friends one minute and enemies the next! By the time we get involved the children have made up or moved on. I have seen these type of situations cause rifts between families over basically nothing.



Sunday, 24 Mar 2019: Third Sunday of Lent - Year C

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

There was a terrible disaster when a building fell down killing eighteen people. Some said, 'Oh, those killed must have been sinners, they or their parents.' Jesus repudiates that notion: 'No, it wasn't for anything *they* did.' It was clear to Jesus that they were the victims of poor construction and conditions at Siloam. Look at the builder.

Responsibility needs to be brought home to those who would otherwise hide behind a religious ideology, or the sheer self-interest of evading blame for a situation.

To identify those really responsible may well require major changes to the way society is organised.

Does it all seem too difficult? Jesus helps us with a metaphor:

You are like a fig tree which may not be bearing much fruit just now,


but, I am a terrific gardener:

I will water you, dig around you, make sure you are well nourished

so that you will bear the fruits I desire.

Our Lord does that by watering us with the waters of baptism; pruning us, especially during Lent; nourishing us with the bread of life in Holy Communion.

We might pause at various times during Lent to allow Our Lord to garden us so that he may create a heavenly botanical garden, a new Eden, of the whole of humanity.



LEARNING MATTERS



With the launch of Bernie Bright in week 5 of this term the staff have been engaged in driving the message of positive behaviour for learning in many aspects of school life. The focus for the last two weeks has been respectful behaviour both at assembly and in lining up in the morning, recess and lunchtime.

The focus for the next two weeks will be built around the school motto of "I am Safe".

With this in mind we will be targeting afternoon dismissal. Drive Through, Pickup, Bus and Walkers.

The children will be reminded of safe behaviour in all areas of the school and in the afternoon dismissal.

As a reminder:

Drive through: Children will sit quietly in the hall until they are called. Parents must have the family name clearly displayed and not leave their cars. Children will be called by the supervising teacher to the vehicle. Children must not go to the back of the car to place bags in the boot.

Pick up: Parents are asked to wait in the undercroft area for the children. Children must be collected from the undercroft. Children may not go to the bottom playground without a parent and no child is to use the equipment without a parent supervising. No child will be allowed to leave via the bottom gate without a parent.

Bus: Children who catch buses will be walked from the school and the supervising teacher will wait until all children have caught their bus.

Walkers: Children who walk home from school will be dismissed at bell time and encouraged to walk in groups.

With your support we hope to minimise the risks and promote a safe environment for our school.




A photo of a packet of cupcakes was displayed for Year Three and they were asked what multiplication or division facts could they see in the picture. This is what some of the children came up with.




Kayla was able to draw the turn arounds



Raph could see many number facts




Isabelle remembered the turn around, or commutativity of numbers




Gabriella could label the rows and columns on the array
