### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

### Sunday 27 Aug 2023

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A

Gospel

#### Matthew 16:13-20

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell anyone that he was the Christ.



### **REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA**



The readings highlight two different but related themes: the character of our understanding of Christ, and our understanding of discipleship that flows from it. Christological reflections reach a climax in the question posed to the disciples: Who do you say I am? In this liturgical context, the same question is posed to us. Who is this one who multiplies loaves of bread, who walks on turbulent waters, who breaks the boundaries that separate insider from outsider? It is none other than the messiah.

When Peter testified to Jesus' identity, it was a relevant religious and political statement, for messianic expectation was a burning question at that time. But what does it mean for the average Christian today? Many believers consider messianic expectation a theological theme that belongs to the past. They feel that it is difficult to get excited about the coming of someone who we believe has already come and gone. If Jesus were to pose this question today, how would we answer?

Like Peter, we too may have good intentions, but when they are put to the test we realise that that was all that they were – good intentions. Still, we should not be discouraged by our weaknesses, for just as Peter's failure did not deter God from entrusting him with power and authority, so our failures need not be obstacles to God's grace in our lives. We watch God entrust the church to individuals who are weak and undependable, and we realise that judgments are inscrutable and God's ways unsearchable.

### **CHILDREN'S DISCUSSION STARTERS**

A beginning point for discussion of this week's Gospel with children:

In today's Gospel, what question did Jesus ask his disciples?

What did Simon Peter boldly say?

Let us take a few moments to think how we might answer Jesus' question.

Who do you say Jesus is?

Jesus is both God and human.

How does believing in Jesus change us?

### **Gentle Reminder**

When using the drive thru option before or after school please ensure that you do not leave your car as the Rangers will consider you parked which can secure a \$340 fine. Also be mindful that queuing across the crossing or blocking Evan's Road can also result in a fine.

Children must enter the car from the curb side and at no time be going behind the car or getting in on the drivers side.

Each child takes a different amount of time to get into the car and belt up so please be patient and don't overtake the car in front as this is not safe.

We do not buckle the children into the car so if your child cannot put their own seatbelt on, please consider using the pick up via the back gate option.

As a staff we work really hard to ensure that the children in our care are where they need to be on time. If we are all patient and considerate, drive thru works quite efficiently.

#### <u>Please don't do three point turns in Cox Crescent.</u> Follow the road right around to the end of the Crescent.

When dropping your child off in the morning please be mindful of the following:

- Please don't park and leave your car after 8.30am.
- Watch out for children walking along the footpath and <u>please don't do three point turns in Cox</u> <u>Crescent.</u>
- Don't block residents' driveways.
- Don't park on the opposite side of the road and allow your children to cross Cox Crescent.
- Children being dropped at Cosch need to be walked in by their parents or carer as staff are arriving at this time and parking in the staff car park.

It's our job to work together to ensure that our students are safe.



#### Tap on and tap off, every time you travel by bus

Our school is partnering with the local school bus operator, Busways, to support a new Tap On and Tap Off education campaign encouraging students who travel by bus to correctly use their school Opal cards. Busways is implementing this campaign throughout Term 3, 2023. This campaign will focus on a simple message – tap on and tap off every time you travel by bus.

#### Why is tapping on and off on the bus important?

The use of Opal cards is the primary way bus operators and Transport for NSW analyse demand for bus services. When students don't use their Opal cards, their trip is not recorded. Therefore, buses may appear underutilised. Tapping on and off provides better data to plan better bus services.

#### How can you help?

If your child travels to school by bus, please ensure your child has a valid Opal card (either a School or Child/Youth Opal card). Visit Transport for NSW website to apply for a school Opal card. Students may see onboard bus posters and Busways Community Relation Officers at afternoon loadings. Together let's get students into good habits of tapping on and tapping off with their Opal card. Thank you for your support with this campaign.
