Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A

Sunday 15 Oct 2023

Gospel

Matthew 22:1-10

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He dispatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out on to the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests.'

REFLECTION by Nick Brodie

On the face of it this can be a challenging parable, full of vengeance. Wedding invitees reject their invitations, sometimes violently, and are met with violence in return. Then, in a final plot twist, just when the wedding seems back on track someone is ejected into the darkness outside.

Pope Francis says that this parable shows 'how God reacts' to rejection. God doesn't give up. Rather, He always 'starts over and asks that all those found at the thoroughfares be called, excluding no one.' And those who join in the celebration, the Pope adds, should come wearing an appreciation of God's mercy and an openness to it.

After all, the real heart of the story isn't the action so much as the characters' preoccupations. The first invitees are focused on their properties and their businesses. They don't care to celebrate on anyone else's terms but their own.

Similarly, the under-dressed guest seems unwilling to respond to a new situation in which he finds himself. Doggedly sticking to his old outfit, he shows little respect for his host. When questioned, he makes matters worse by refusing to talk. He seems disposed to drift towards a bitter and self-imposed schism from the celebrating community. Given multiple chances, he just didn't take them. He effectively excluded himself.

Luckily for us, our invitation is still good, beckoning us to join the feast.

Return and Earn


