RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



Last Sunday, we celebrated the feast of Pentecost - the birthday of the Church. Monday after Pentecost: Feast of Mary, Mother of the Church

Every Pentecost Monday, Mary is celebrated under the title of Mother of the Church, initiated by Pope Francis. All dioceses and parishes officially celebrate this feast, which emphasises that Mary is both the Mother of Christ and the Mother of the Church.

24th May: Feast of Mary, Help of Christians

The infant Church in Australia had a special reason for turning to Mary. In those early and mostly priestless days, it was largely the Rosary that kept the faith alive. Catholic Australia remained faithful to Mary, and was the first nation to choose her, under the title of Help of Christians, as principal Patroness and the first country to have a mother-cathedral under the same title.

Gospel

Matthew 28:16-20

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'

REFLECTION by Nick Brodie

When Pope Francis instituted the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy in 2015 he said the following: 'Mercy: the word reveals the very mystery of the Most Holy Trinity.'

'With our eyes fixed on Jesus and his merciful gaze,' the Pope went on to say, 'we experience the love of the Most Holy Trinity. The mission Jesus received from the Father was that of revealing the mystery of divine love in its fullness.' The Pope reminds us that Jesus showed us what mercy looks like. The signs he works, especially in favour of sinners, the poor, the marginalised, the sick, and the suffering, are all meant to teach mercy. Everything in him speaks of mercy. Nothing in him is devoid of compassion.'

Which shows us what kind of community our Merciful God calls us to be. 'Mercy is the very foundation of the Church's life,' declared Pope Francis, reminding us that 'nothing in her preaching and in her witness to the world can be lacking in mercy.'

'All of her pastoral activity should be caught up in the tenderness she makes present to believers,' he stresses.

'From the heart of the Trinity, from the depths of the mystery of God,' the Pope concludes, 'the great river of mercy wells up and overflows unceasingly. It is a spring that will never run dry, no matter how many people draw from it. Every time someone is in need, he or she can approach it, because the mercy of God never ends.'

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen

REPORTS AND ASSESSMENTS

Our teachers are currently in the midst of compiling reports and collecting assessments for all students. This is a crucial part of our effort to provide comprehensive feedback on your child's progress and achievements throughout the Semester.

Here are a few key points we would like to share with you:

Report compilation: teachers are gathering data from various assignments, tests, and classroom activities to compile detailed reports. These reports will highlight your child's strengths, areas for improvement, and overall performance.

Assessment collection: to ensure a thorough evaluation, teachers are also collecting assessments. These assessments may include exams, presentations, projects, and other forms of evaluation that have been conducted over the two terms. These assessments will be available for you to view at the parent teacher interviews at the end of the term or on request to take at home.

Feedback and communication: once the reports are completed, we will share them with you. We encourage you to review the report and discuss it with your child. Our teachers will be available for meetings at the end of the term to discuss the reports or answer any questions you may have.

MATHEMATICAL LANGUAGE

Here are some common mathematical terms that you may find in your child's report, depending on their age and stage.

Array

An array is a way of organising materials into equal columns and rows. Arrays can also be sketched and are used in multiplicative situations. We can see arrays in real life in many places. The one below could be described as 3 rows of 2 or 2 columns of 3.



Balancing equations

A common misconception among children is that the equals sign (=) only means the answer. It also refers to equivalence, or 'the same as'. This understanding is useful when children are asked to balance equations.

For example:

6 + 4 = 9 + 1

Both sides of the equation equal 10, which is a balanced equation.

Commutativity

The commutative property of addition or multiplication means that two numbers can be added or multiplied in any order and the solution will be the same.

For example:

 $3 \times 6 = 18$ or $6 \times 3 = 18$

12 + 8 = 20 or 8 + 12 = 20
